**Re: Approval of Pre-Filing Request**

Dear Ms. Tonery:

Thank you for your letter, filed June 1, 2015, requesting use of the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission's (FERC or Commission) pre-filing review process for the planned Stage 3 Project (Project). We believe that beginning review of this proposal prior to the receipt of your application will greatly improve our ability to identify issues early and address them in our environmental document.

As stated in your June 1, 2015 letter to the Commission, Cheniere Corpus Christi Liquefaction, LLC, and Cheniere Corpus Christi Pipeline, LP (Cheniere Corpus Christi) plans to add facilities at its recently authorized liquefaction terminal. The Project would include two liquefaction trains, each capable of processing up to approximately 700 million cubic feet per day of natural gas, one 160,000 cubic meter full containment liquefied natural gas tank, one 22-mile-long, 42-inch-diameter pipeline, additional compression at the Sinton Compressor Station, and appurtenant facilities. The planned Project would be located on property southeast of the City of Gregory, Texas and immediately north of the liquefaction project site that is currently under construction.

Your letter states that Cheniere Corpus Christi intends to file an application in January 2016. When Cheniere Corpus Christi files its application with the Commission, we will evaluate the progress made during the pre-filing process,

based in part on your success in resolving the issues identified during scoping. Once we determine that your application is ready for processing, we will establish a schedule for completion of the environmental document and for the issuance of all other federal authorizations.

My staff has reviewed the third-party contractor proposal submittal and agrees that Perennial Environmental Services, LLC (Perennial) is appropriate to work under the direct supervision and control of the Commission staff in preparing the National Environmental Policy Act documentation. I request that you proceed with executing a contract with Perennial so work may begin as soon as possible.
