

CASE STUDY: Responding to Hurricane Laura

In August 2020, Hurricane Laura, the strongest storm on record to make landfall in Louisiana, had a profound impact on our communities. We began working with local organizations before the storm hit; our employees helped with pre-storm cleanup and protection for the historic Sabine Pass Lighthouse. Immediately after the storm, we conducted reconnaissance flyovers and shared our videos and images with local government officials to aid their rescue and response efforts. We also donated fuel, potable water, ice and safety supplies to nearby community groups and local first responders. We continued these donations until governments and local charities were able to provide ongoing support.

In the weeks and months that followed, we donated more than \$1 million in relief funds to local organizations as part of our corporate giving and sponsored recovery supply drives, and we provided over \$1.7 million of financial assistance for hurricane relief to employees. One event, held in partnership with the Houston Astros, collected two trailer trucks of supplies for delivery to the Catholic Charities of Lake Charles. Our employees supplemented company efforts by raising an additional \$100,000 in relief funds through the Cheniere Employee Giving Fund.
